Stewardship is an interesting term. We often equate it with giving. One of my good friends and longtime mentors, Ray Lyne, taught me, "Giving does not make one a steward. Giving is something a steward does. But it doesn't make him a steward." He stated that anyone with even one dollar of God's assets is a steward, regardless of what he does with it. On the other hand, the Donor Advised Fund costs nothing to set up. It can be created in one day with as little as \$5,000. And all administration is handled by Dallas Seminary Foundation.

Stewardship is knowing that all that we have is God's. And, because it is His, we have the responsibility—and the privilege—to manage it for His glory.

Consider all that God has entrusted to you. The financial and material resources. The people He has placed in your life. Ask yourself what you can do to honor and please the Master through the way in which you handle those resources and relationships.
