God's Needs

The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else.

So how does God benefit from our contribution? What does He receive that isn't already His? He receives our engagement. He receives our hearts. He receives our love. God does not need anything, but He loves it when we give back to Him. That is one way we can show Him our love.
